A new female coin collector of the 18th century: Katherine Blount (née Butler)

Introduction

Katherine Butler (1676-1752) was the daughter of James Butler of Amberley Castle, Sussex, and she married Thomas Pope Blount (1670-1731) on 8 December 1695.¹ She has recently attracted some attention on the *Early Modern Female Book Ownership* website as an early female book collector.²

Some information about her can be gleaned from J. Van Koughnet, *A History of Tyttenhanger* (London, [1895]):

p. 65: His wife, on the contrary, was a brilliant woman, full of cleverness and highly cultivated, fond of poetry, a lover of all that was refined and artistic, interesting herself in the passing world of her day, and gifted with amind full of energy. Sir Godfrey Kneller's portrait of her is handsome and determined-looking.³ She was a friend of Alexander Pope, with whom she corresponded. He was connected with her husband through the Founder of Trinity.

p. 66: ... Katherine has ever remained a remarkable character amongst the ladies of this family. She was an imperious woman, but was evidently much respected. She had a large collection of all sorts of curiosities at Twickenham, and some are still remaining at Tyttenhanger, to which place they were brought. To her belonged ... the Chinese cabinet containing a collection of coins ...

p. 91: Katherine Lady Blount died on March 2nd, 1753, leaving her books, prints, coins, medals, rarities, and curiosities to her son, Sir Harry Pope Blount, and at his death [1757], which took place on July 31st, 1756, they went to his sister Catherine [1704-1763, wife of William Freeman, who had an only child Catherine (b 1735) who married 1755 the Hon Charles Yorke but died in 1759].

After her death, an inventory of her collection was made by Angel Carmey and Abraham Langford, presumably acting on behalf of Langfords.⁴ It is listed by 'Drawer', and the contents of 109 drawers are described, presumably belonging to the 'Chinese cabinet'. The first 31 drawers list her coin collection, sometimes giving much detail, and arranged by gold, silver and copper. Within in each category, the listing is not chronological, suggesting that

her collection was an accumulation, rather than an object of study. Most of the coins were silver, although there is a substantial gold component. The copper coins were almost all Roman bronzes.

She owned just over 1000 coins and medals:

Katherine Blount's will mentions her collection of coins and medals, together with the very elaborate arrangements (ultimately unsuccessful!) she made to keep them, her books and curiosities together:⁵

Whereas I have in my Closet (the Room so called) at Twickenham aforesaid a Collection of Coins Medals Raritys and Curiositys both natural and Artificial and also several Book and prints all which I am very anxious should be kept together and enjoyed as is hereafter mentioned (except those hereafter named which I shall dispose of to other persons) and for that end I direct that in convenient time after my death and before they be removed out of my Closet and other places a true and perfect Inventory shall be made thereof (except as aforesaid) and sign'd by my Son S^r Harry Pope Blount or other of my Issue that shall be owner of Tittenhanger House in Hertfordshire and attested by 2 or more witnesses ... I will that the said Raritys Books and things aforesaid shall be kept together in one Room there or in some other Convenient Room elsewhere where the Heir of my Family resides. And I hereby give limit and appoint the use and enjoyment of all the said Books Raritys and things to the said S^r Harry Pope Blount during his life and after his death to the Heirs Male of his Body or in default of of such to the Heir Male of my Body James Pope Blount and after his death to the Heirs Male of his Body during their respective and successive lives only. And for want of such Issue to my Daughter Freeman for her life and after her death to her oldest Son or in default of such to her oldest Daughter and their respective oldest som successively for their respectives lives only. And for want of such Issue I give limit and appoint the same to my Nephew John Butler and his Heirs absolutely. and for the better preserving and securing of the said Books Raritys and things so as they may go together entire in Succession as aforesaid which is my intention and earnest desire I will that whosoever shall by virtue hereof claim the same shall respectively and successively within 10 days of such Right shall accrue to him or her give a Bond of sufficient penalty to the person that is next to take in Succession as aforesaid or his or her Guardian or Trustee Condition that the said Books Raritys and things shall be kept entire together in one Room and not to be disposed of Spoiled or wasted. And shall be so left entire at the death of such Obliger. And if any of the said persons shall refuse to give such Bond that then the said Books

Raritys \and things/ shall immediately go and belong to such person as by virtue hereof would be entitles to the enjoyment of them in case such person so refusing was dead. And in like manner as if such person so refusing was then really dead any thing herein to the Contrary notwithstanding.

... all the plate China pictures etc that are in and belong to my Closet should go with the Coines Medals and other Raritys and be kept together with them.

The wills of her son Harry Pope Blount (1670-1731), her daughter Catherine Freeman (1704-63) and her granddaughter Catherine Yorke (1736-59) have have not been found.

So, at this point, the trail would have ended. However, the Christie's sale for 4 April 1967, offered new information.⁶ The sale is entitled: 'The property of the Lady Moyra Loyd, the Right Honourable The Earl of Caladon, the Right Honourable The Lord Margadale of Islay, T.D., Lieutenant-Colonel G.H. Hay, DSO, and Mrs J.E. Mitchell'. The header before lot 49 names the 'Earl of Caledon'⁷ and presumably all of lots 49-168 are from his collection. The sale goes on to say:

It seems that the majority of the following collection passed to the present owner's family on the marriage of Katharine Butler, eldest daughter of James Butler of Amberley Castle, Sussex, to Sir Thomas Pope Blount, in 1695, when a collection of coins and curiosities is recorded as being in her possession.⁸ Traditionally a few of the coins were owned by the latter's grandfather, Sir Henry Blount who had charge of the Prince of Wales and the Duke of York at the Battle of Edgehill (1642). A few of the coins have obviously been acquired by the family later.⁹

Presumably this entry is based partly on Van Koughnet's book. Perhaps oral history in 1967 was the source of the supposed link to Henry Blount (1602-80), for which no other evidence has been found.¹⁰

Lot 168 is 'a black lacquer and polychrome coin cabinet with twenty two drawers, the doors and sides carved with Oriental figures, trees and buildings, mounted with engraved brass

hinges, lock plates and handles, on an ebonised stand -29 *in. high*, 19in wide'. This sounds like the 'Chinese cabinet', mentioned above.
